

The EU Knowledge Hub on Preventing Radicalisation (EUKH) brings together practitioners, policy makers and researchers working on prevention across Europe and in priority third countries. The establishment of the Hub is foreseen in the EU Counter-Terrorism Agenda 2020.

OBJECTIVES

The Euro-Arab Foundation, among other aspects, will lead the Strategic Communication line (StratComms) for the prevention of radicalisation and violent extremism, it involves in the Thematic Panels, conducts joint policy and practice events, training workshops and ad hoc events, as well as study visits, among other tailor-made support services.

RESTORATIVE AND VICTIM- CENTRED APPROACH TO MITIGATE HATE AND (VIOLENT) EXTREMISM

Through a victim-centred approach, it provides key practitioners with know-how and practical tools to better understand and interact with victims of hate crimes and (violent) extremism. HAMPERING HATE SPEECH AND DISINFORMATION THROUGH AI TECH

Hatedemics aims to enable NGO/CSOs, media professionals (fact-checkers and journalists), public authorities, and youngsters as activists to respond to online hate and fake news, with a particular focus on contrasting those pernicious and under-studied phenomena that lie at the crossroads between hate speech and disinformation. The project will empower these target groups to counter instances of hate speech and hate crimes that are rooted in disinformation and affect several vulnerable groups.

OBJECTIVES

To develop and validate in 4 Member States the Hatedemics Platform, design and deploy interactive training and educational paths, informed by a commitment to EU values and rights, raise awareness and fostering active participation of EU-27 citizens.

PREVENT AND COUNTER INTERSECTIONAL DATA DISCRIMINATION

DATA EQUALITY focuses on data-driven discrimination and how to prevent this through multi-agency cooperation. It aims to develop a shared European methodology for CSOs, LEAs, and judiciary agencies that will allow them to cooperate more effectively in the collection, management analysis and exchange of information regarding the phenomenon of data discrimination, at the local, national and European levels.

OBJECTIVES

To assess current methodologies and challenges in collecting, managing, analysing, and exchanging data on discrimination in Europe. To provide new settings for cooperation among LEAs/Judicial bodies, CSOs and discrimination experts. To develop a new methodology to be applied to AI-and-OSINT based tools.

STANDING UP AGAINST HATE IN THE EU

1st January, 2022- 1st January 2024 The primary goal of STAND-UP is to enhance collaboration among various organizations to combat hate crimes by introducing a fresh inter-institutional model spearheaded by public authorities. By utilizing Open Source Intelligence (OSINT) methods and tools, STAND-UP aims to enable public authorities and CSOs to pinpoint areas requiring intervention, identify vulnerable groups, and assess the intensity of online hate speech.

PARTICIPATORY APPROACHES TO PROTECTING PLACES OF WORSHIP

PARTES strives to enhance the safeguarding of places of worship in European nations by creating a thorough prevention model that is evidence-based, inclusive, and participatory. By employing an evidence-based and participatory method along with a societal approach, it particularly focuses on enhancing collaboration between public authorities and faith-based communities, organizing awareness-raising campaigns, conducting training sessions and workshops, and sharing and evaluating best practices and tools in this area.

SOLUTIONS TO ENHANCE INTERFAITH PROTECTION OF PLACES OF WORSHIP FROM TERRORIST DANGER

SHIELD aims to protect Christian, Jewish and Muslim places of worship from terrorist attacks in 11 countries of the EU, enhancing cooperation between public and private actors, raising awareness of the danger of terrorism, and developing new or upgrade methodologies and solutions to protect places of worship and mitigate the effects of attacks. Both the capacity of the Member States and the EU itself will be improved in the management of risks related to terrorism, the protection of people and buildings.

OBJECTIVES

To conceptualise solutions to protect places of worship and, more generally, religious buildings from terrorist threats. To connect EU public and private actors, including representatives of the Christian, Jewish and Muslim communities, security practitioners, LEAs, municipalities, experts in risk detection and technological partners.

SCHOOLS, RELIGIOUS COMMUNITIES & LOCAL AUTHORITIES' HARMONISED INITIATIVE TO ENHANCE LOCAL RESILIENCE

SHIELDed aims to enhance the safety of soft targets like places of worship, schools, and religious organizations by moving beyond overly securitized and reactive measures. It proposes a comprehensive interfaith and cross-sectoral approach, empowering key practitioners (religious leaders, law enforcement, educators, community workers) and raising awareness among communities and youth. A core objective of SHIELDed is to improve collaboration between public authorities, law enforcement, and religious institutions.

OBJECTIVES

To establish Local Shielding Councils to address specific local security needs. To develope a collaboration protocol and guidelines at local and national levels. TAKEDOWN generates novel knowledge on OC/TN and addresses this challenge with research based on a multidimensional modelling approach.

DISRUPTION OF THE DIGITAL BUSINESS MODEL OF **TRAFFICKERS**

INTERCEPTED seeks to revolutionize the digital landscape of combatting Trafficking in Human Beings (THB) by enhancing the digital capacities of law enforcement and judicial bodies. To achieve this goal, it concentrates on disrupting the trafficking chain at two crucial points: recruitment and advertisement. This strategy considers the diverse methods employed in language, platforms, targets, and strategies, which depend on the victims' profiles and the nature of exploitation.

OBJECTIVES

To design an early interception tool specifically targeting the recruitment of victims and advertisement of services, establish a common European mechanism for the detection and reporting, strengthen multi-agency cooperation and rapid cross-border responses and ensure successful use of digital evidence in court.

COUNTERING HUMAN TRAFFICKING THROUGH THE **ANALYSIS OF BIG DATA AND OPEN SOURCE INTELLIGENCE** (OSINT)

The use of the internet has been integrated into the business model of trafficking in human beings (THB), giving rise to new forms of exploitation that, according to the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) GLOTIP 2020 Report, facilitates access to and recruitment of victims, while allowing for the anonymity of perpetrators and profiteers and the opacity of financial transactions.

OBJECTIVES

As an extension of the European UNCHAINED project, BIGOSINT develop and test advanced, intelligence-led tools to enhance internet-based human trafficking investigations, focusing on the various roles played by the cyberenvironment in the trafficking chain.
